**NOTES:**

1. HS 477 and HS 487 may not be taken before HS 222.
2. This program contains a World Civilization and a U.S. History primary area (18 hours each required), a government support (12 hours), and 10 hours of general social science to meet Indiana State certification requirements. Electives are chosen to meet the requirements for the primary selected by the student.
3. This program leads to a major in history. Other college majors are possible in combination with a social studies teaching program but require more hours.
4. Nine hours must be taken from the following Political Science courses: PS 355, 377, 444, 466, or an approved J-Term Political Science course. The nine hours must include PS 377 or 466.
5. Students must take 6 additional elective hours of History or dual-listed History/Political Science courses.
4. ED 395 Practicum in Teaching should be scheduled during January Term of the junior or senior year.
5. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours are required for graduation.
