3. 18 hours of economics and finance electives are required for an economic and finance major. Students may choose from EB 321, 324, 325, 331, 346, 376, 381, 413, 421, 436, 446, 461, or other approved EB courses.
4. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
5. Students must take three of the following OA215 Business Software Application courses: Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Database, Computer Graphics, Web Page Design
6. PY 111 is recommended for those who anticipate having a minor in marketing or entrepreneurial small business.
