3. Students must take three of the following OA215 Business Software Application courses: Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Database, Computer Graphics, Web Page Design
4. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
5. PY 111 is recommended for those who anticipate having a minor in marketing or entrepreneurial small business.
