- Ten elective hours representing at least two departments must be chosen from the following courses: BR 331, 333, 421, 440, 460; EN 331CC, 481; MI 285CSL (provided it is not taken to fulfill the Core Curriculum requirements); HS 322, 361, 411; PY 341 and any approved January term course.
- Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
