How To Prevent Spreading the Flu

- **Avoid close contact with people who are sick.** When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick, too.
- **Stay home when you are sick.** If possible, stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness.
- **Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing.** It may prevent those around you from getting sick.
- **Wash your hands often.** This will help protect you from germs.
- **Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth.** Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
