FINAL DAY TO ADD A CLASS for fall semester is Friday, September 3. You must submit a completed change of registration form to the Registrar's office (complete with all required signatures) no later than 5:00 PM on September 3 if you wish to add a class for this semester.

FINAL DAY TO REQUEST S/U GRADING for a fall semester course is Monday, September 13. S/U grading may be requested only for elective courses that will not count in your major or core requirements.

Students with Disabilities: In compliance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Huntington College will make reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities. To be eligible for accommodations, a student must have a learning, psychological, orthopedic, or sensory disability that substantially limits one or more major life activities, and provide documentation of the disability. You can access your student information via the Web!

If you have financial clearance for fall semester, you can view your fall registration (and print a copy if you wish), your billing statement, your academic record and even use the GPA Estimator to predict your grade point average at the end of this semester. If you have financial clearance, you do not need to stop by the Business Office when you arrive on campus unless you just want to be friendly. The website is <http://myinfo.huntington.edu>. Your user name is your student ID number (just the numbers without the "s" at the beginning that is needed when you access the campus network). If you have never been on the site and changed your password, the last 5 digits of your social security number is your temporary password. You should change your password the first time you access the system (by clicking on the *Change PIN* button at the top of the screen) to help keep your information private. We hope that you will enjoy using the system!
