"Did You Know" Homemade ice pack - You can make your own inexpensive ice pack. Fill a heavy -duty freezer bag three-quarters full using one part rubbing alcohol and three parts water. Seal the bag and place it inside another sealed bag to keep it from leaking. Put the bag in the freezer and pull it out when needed. This makes a soft, flexible pack. Add a little more alcohol if you want the bag to be even softer.

HEALTH SERVICES - All **first year students** to Huntington University should have turned in a yellow health record form, which would include their immunization records as well as a physical by a physician. If this record is not complete and on file with the Health Services Dept., students will be **placed on hold status** and be unable to register for classes. Also, if students are still needing to receive a Menomune shot for meningitis, tetanus shot, or TB test, stop by Health Services between the hours of 10:00 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. to have those completed. If these shots or tests are **not complete** students can also be placed on hold status.

Students that are still needing to begin the Hepatitis A or Hepatitis B shot series, need to begin the series immediately. **Both the Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B shots are required for those students going to assist with hurricane relief or traveling outside of the United States.** Please keep in mind that the Hepatitis A is a 2-shot series and the Hepatitis B is a 3-shot series.
