It's easy to become dehydrated when exercising in cold weather because of the water you lose from sweating and breathing (you have to warm and moisten the cold air you inhale). As you exhale you lose water; when you "see" your breath, you're seeing water droplets. Moreover, urine production is stimulated by the cold.
