"Did You Know"? Want to get a good night's sleep? Then whatever you do, don't talk on your cell phone before you go to bed! A study at the University of Zurich found that exposing people to the electromagnetic fields from cell phones altered their brain waves during sleep...resulting in sleep disturbances! Remember to file your FAFSA (FREE Application for Federal Student Aid) by March 10, 2006 by going to the website at www.fafsa.ed.gov after January 1st. If you filed the paper FAFSA for 2005/2006, you will **NOT** receive a renewal application at your home address. If you filed on the web, you should receive an email notifying you to file online. The Financial Aid Office has a FAFSA ON THE WEB WORKSHEET available to assist with your online filing if you wish to pick one up. They also have the paper FAFSA forms for those who do not have online access. **YOU MUST FILE THE FAFSA TO RECEIVE ANY STATE AND/OR FEDERAL AID AND TO QUALIFY FOR A FEDERAL STAFFORD LOAN.**
