Travel to Africa with Go-Ed! Experience a semester in Africa for what it would cost you to attend Huntington University—and this includes airfare to Africa. Your only other financial obligation would be to get to the departure city, Phoenix, AZ, where you will visit the Food for the Hungry headquarters and go through a pre-trip orientation. Huntington has joined with Food for the Hungry to develop its own off campus opportunity in Africa, and one of the advantages of the program is that there are **internships available that may satisfy those required in some majors**, though you would need to work with your advisor to determine this. The basic courses include African Traditions and Religion, African Literature, International Economics (using Africa as a focus). Students will spend most of the time in Uganda but will have the opportunity to travel to Ethiopia to study Ethiopian History and Religion or to Rwanda to study Peace and Justice.
