J-term in Phoenix, Arizona Attention education and social work majors!!!! Experience "hands-on" learning in the sunny southwest during j-term 2007. Through a cooperative arrangement with Food for the Hungry, education majors and social work majors can experience a cultural experience of teaching and community service in Phoenix. Theatre of Diversity J-term 2007 Trip!!! Cost is approx. \$1500 (it may be less). Spend about 10 days in the BIG APPLE seeing some good theatre!! If interested, please contact either Prof. Burnett or Dr. Heller. **ATTENTION** - You don't have to be a theatre or English student to enjoy the trip. You don't have to be a student at all. Spouses, family and friends are welcome to go. They won't get J-term credit, though.

J-Term in China - Want to spend J-term 2007 in China with Bill Fisher, Luke Fetters, and a group of your fellow students. We're having an interest meeting on Thursday evening, April 27th at 8 PM in the Ad Annex lower level (down where the Ministry & Missions department is located). Course Description: There are mixed signals coming from The People's Republic of China regarding the state of the Christian Church. We hear reports of persecution and we hear apparently conflicting stories about government-approved mass production of Bibles. Students in this course will have the opportunity to visit Hong Kong, Macau, Guangzhou, Xian and Beijing. In these locations, students will engage in service learning and encounter firsthand the variety of contemporary Christian experiences in China. Set against the backdrop of traditional Buddhism and communistic atheism, students will interact with leaders of unregistered house churches as well as leaders of the government-approved Three-Self Church. Students will encounter Christians who smuggle Bibles into China and, also tour the Amity Foundation, which publishes hundreds of thousands of Bibles each year for legal distribution.

Travel to Africa with Go-Ed! Experience a semester in Africa **for what it would cost you to attend Huntington University—and this includes airfare to Africa.** Your only other financial obligation would be to get to the departure city, Phoenix, AZ, where you will visit the Food for the Hungry headquarters and go through a pre-trip orientation. Huntington has joined with Food for the Hungry to develop its own off campus opportunity in Africa, and one of the advantages of the program is that there are **internships available that may satisfy those required in some majors**, though you would need to work with your advisor to determine this. The basic courses include African Traditions and Religion, African Literature, International Economics (using Africa as a focus). Students will spend most of the time in Uganda but will have the opportunity to travel to Ethiopia to study Ethiopian History and Religion or to Rwanda to study Peace and Justice.
