FINAL DAY TO REQUEST S/U GRADING for a fall semester course is Monday, September 12. S/U grading may be requested only for elective courses that will not count in your major or core requirements.

To access your grades on the Web: The web site to access your grades, degree audit and other academic information is <http://myinfo.huntington.edu>. Your user name is your student ID number (just the numbers without the "s" at the beginning that is needed when you access the campus network). The last five digits of your social security number will be your temporary password unless you have already changed your password to something more unique. You should change your password the first time you access the system (by clicking on the *Change PIN* button at the top of the screen) to help keep your information private.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES: In compliance with section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, Huntington University will make reasonable accommodations for students with disabilities. To be eligible for accommodations, a student must have a learning, psychological, orthopedic, or sensory disability that substantially limits one or more major life activities, and provide documentation of the disability. TRIP TO THE HOLY LAND – ISRAEL -Are you interested in spending January's J-Term in Israel? We are planning to tour Bethlehem, Jerusalem, Caesarea, Samaria, Nazareth, Galilee, Jericho, the Dead Sea, Negev, Egypt and several other places. January 2006 travel opportunity: PARIS. I am offering a J-term that involves a trip to Paris. The cost of the trip (**7 days in Paris**) would be approximately \$1500 which would include airfare, travel in France, morning and evening meals, and most entrance fees. (Adjustments to the price may need to be made to account for travel to the airport and fluctuating ticket prices, but it should remain within \$200 of this approximation); you would be responsible for your own spending money. The J-term will involve spending the first week or so on campus studying the history of Paris; then we will spend the second week (January 11-January 19 2006) in Paris. If you are interested, I need to know by the end of September. Payment is due by October 1st.
