Worship Seminar "Worship Band Workshop" - Tuesday, September 27, MCA, #150 from 4:30-6:00 PM. This seminar is the first in a series of six sponsored by the new worship leadership program at Huntington University. Each seminar is free and open to all students, faculty, and members of the community.

Worship Band Workshop is a DVD seminar by worship leader and Dove Award-winning song writer, Paul Baloche. Using examples from several live worship events, Paul and his band demonstrate important concepts that include mapping out a song, improving your timing, thinking like an arranger, band dynamics and tempo, guitar vs. piano driven songs, making music more emotional, and creating an atmosphere of worship.

January 2006 travel opportunity: PARIS. I am offering a J-term that involves a trip to Paris. The cost of the trip (**7 days in Paris**) **would be approximately \$1500 which would include airfare, travel in France, morning and evening meals, and most entrance fees.** (Adjustments to the price may need to be made to account for travel to the airport and fluctuating ticket prices, but it should remain within \$200 of this approximation); you would be responsible for your own spending money. The J-term will involve spending the first week or so on campus studying the history of Paris; then we will spend the second week (January 11-January 19 2006) in Paris. If you are interested, I need to know by the end of September. Payment is due by October 1st.
