FROM THE FINANCIAL AID OFFICE:

Attention: Financial aid recipients! The FAFSA must be submitted to be considered for financial aid for the 04-05 academic school year. For Indiana residents **the FAFSA must be received at the Federal Processor before March 10, 2004.** For Out-of-State residents, we recommend students file by the same deadline to receive maximum consideration for financial aid. MEAL PLAN INFORMATION:

J-term starts on the Monday, January 5th and goes through the 21st lunch. The J-term break is from dinner on the 21st to the 25th. This is considered a grace period that a student may eat without forfeiting their \$100 FLEX dollars for those who were not here over J-term. All Students who are on a meal plan (F, P, or T) will be placed on a full meal plan for J-term (3 meals per day) effective Monday, January 5-21 (lunch). All board students may eat during the J-term break (January 21, Dinner through January 25, Dinner) without forfeiting any of their Flex Dollars. The spring meal plans begin on Monday, January 26th with breakfast. New Flex Dollars will be distributed at the beginning of the second semester.

Students on the F or P meal plans who are off board during J-term will receive an additional \$100 Flex Dollars to be used during the spring semester. Flex Dollars from the fall semester also can be carried forward to second semester. Since no Flex dollars are included with the T (60-meal) plans, there is no additional Flex dollars added for J-term for those who are off board.
