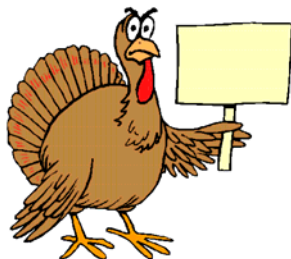

**Volunteer Opportunity** - Would you like to mentor teens that go through Teen Court in Huntington? Teen Court is run through the Youth Service Bureau. Teen Court is a chance for first time offenders (ages 9-17) to admit guilt and receive a sentence; it gives them a second chance. Usually they get community service or may have to attend classes about alcohol or tobacco. Each teen will have 90 days to finish his or her sentence and during the 90 days they will meet with a mentor. An idea of the mentor's duties during the 90 days-meet with the teen at least 2 times in person, and 3 times through phone/email, and then touch base with them 1 time every 2 weeks.
