FINAL EXAM SCHEDULE: Students who have three or more final exams (at least two of which are comprehensive finals) on the same day may petition to take an exam at a different time. **Travel plans are NOT a basis for petitioning for a schedule change.** Make sure that your travel plans are based on when you will have completed your exams.

STUDENTS WHO EXPECT TO GRADUATE IN MAY:

Remember that you **MUST** attend the Commencement ceremonies in order to graduate from Huntington College. (See 2002-2004 Catalog, p.20). Do not plan trips, weddings, or other festivities that would keep you from sharing the graduation ceremony with your classmates. Commencement will be on Sat., May 15.

Accreditation Open Meeting - Consultant-Evaluators from the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools would like to talk to Huntington College students in an open meeting. The topic is the College's strengths and challenges and how well the College is accomplishing its purposes. **The meeting--which is for students only, no faculty or administrators--will be held on Tuesday, April 27, at 4:00 in the HUB.** Free chips, cheese, and salsa will be served.

And now for something completely different: The Shakespeare Film Festival will feature *Ran (Chaos)*, an adaptation of *King Lear* by Japanese director Akira Kurosawa. Kurosawa is often ranked as one of the world's best director, and *Ran* as one of his best movies. The film lasts 2 hours, 40 minutes. In Japanese with English subtitles. Monday, April 19 at 7 p.m. in Loew-Brenn 122. This film is rated R for war violence (relatively mild compared to some recent war films).

ADMINISTRATIVE

ATTENTION FULL-TIME STUDENTS NOT ALREADY ENROLLED IN THE HUNTINGTON PLAN TUITION FREEZE PROGRAM:

To participate in The Huntington Plan, which is a tuition freeze program, students (who are **not** currently enrolled in The Huntington Plan) and their parents (if the student is under 21 years old) must complete, sign and submit a contract and pay a non-refundable one-time fee. This fee is equal to 10% of the current annual tuition that you paid during the 2003/2004 school year. The deadline for enrolling in The Huntington Plan is **May 1, 2004**. Letters and contracts have been mailed to parents of full-time students who are currently enrolled at Huntington College and who are not already participating in the Huntington Plan. Contracts are also available in the business office. Please bring your completed contract and the non-refundable enrollment fee to the business office **before** the May 1, 2004 deadline.
