"Did You Know?".....from Health Services

Lovin' Spoonfuls - When you're spooning up liquid medicines, are you sure that you're measuring up? A recent study found that caregivers who used a regular teaspoon to deliver liquid medication measured the dosage incorrectly nearly 40% of the time. A common tableware teaspoon may hold anywhere from one-half to twice as much as a measured teaspoon. For an accurate liquid dose, use a standard measuring spoon; or, if provided, use the measuring device that comes with the medicine.
