Visit the Florida Everglades in January as part of the new J-Term course, American Environmental History! The course covers topics in North American natural history and ecology from the pre-Colombian period to the present, including changing patterns of land use, economic development and natural resource appropriation, changing forest and wetlands biomes, and environmental ethics. Special attention will be given to concepts in Christian environmental stewardship. The eight-day field experience in Everglades and Biscayne National Parks features close study of wetlands and coastal ecologies, so students should be prepared for hiking, canoeing, snorkeling, sailing, camping, and other outdoor activities. Total cost for travel, food, lodging, and other expenses is \$350. Non-refundable deposits of \$100 must be paid to the Business Office by November 1st, and final balance is due December 9th. It was a very safe environment to explore any and all questions about marriage with experienced couples. We strongly advise anyone who is thinking about marriage to enroll in this class." **An important part of this course** will be a three-day retreat at a ski lodge in Michigan.
