HEALTH SERVICES - All **first year students** to Huntington University should have turned in a yellow health record form, which would include their immunization records as well as a physical by a physician. If this record is not complete and on file with the Health Services Dept., students will be **placed on hold status** and be unable to register for classes. Also, if students are still needing to receive a Menomune shot for meningitis, tetanus shot, or TB test, stop by Health Services between the hours of 10:00am and 2:30pm to have those completed. If these shots or tests are **not complete** students can also be placed on hold status. Students that are still needing to begin the Hepatitis A or Hepatitis B shot series, need to begin that starting the week of October 31. Both the Hepatitis A and Hepatitis B shots are required for those students going to assist with hurricane relief or traveling outside of the United States. Please keep in mind that the Hepatitis A is a 2 shot series and the Hepatitis B is a 3 shot series. If you have any questions, contact Health Services at **ext. 4072**.

From Health Services - Our department has just received some new information regarding flu shots that are to be given in the Huntington area at the following locations: Owen's Supermarket (North) on **Nov. 14 and Nov. 21 from 10:00 am - 1:30 pm** at a cost of \$18.00 for individuals 18 and over. K-Mart on **Nov. 19 from 10:00 am-2:00 pm** at a cost of \$25.00 for individuals 18 and over. They will also offer the pneumonia shot for \$35.00. You may want to call the day before to be sure that they did receive the vaccine. Owen's phone number is 356-1811 (ask for the pharmacy) and K-Mart's pharmacy number is 356-2226. There are two other locations that may be receiving the vaccine and we will let you know if and when they will be giving the shots. If you have questions, please feel free to **contact Health Services at x-4072**.

REMINDER: Students will be placed on a hold status and will be unable to register for classes or receive a transcript if they have **any** outstanding financial obligations. These obligations can include, but are not limited to, student account balances (loans not processed/dispensed or AMS payment plan shortages), parking fines, dorm fines, disciplinary fines, chapel fines, medical fines (failure to pay for vaccinations), past-due rent, library fines or overdue library materials. **All library fines must be paid at the library**, however all other fines can be paid in the business office during cashier hours. **The cashier hours in the business office are 9:00 AM until 4:00 PM Monday through Friday.** Please make payments in the business office during cashier hours.
