H.U. HEALTH FAIR - On **Wednesday, February 22**, the Health Services Dept. will sponsor a Health Fair for students and staff. The event will be in the upper level of the DC beginning at **7:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.** The fair will include blood screens, assessments, massage, & other services. All booths and exhibits are at no charge, except for the blood screens, which will be given at a reduced cost. The following blood tests can be scheduled: **Chem-17**, a blood test for various conditions such as, high blood sugar, cholesterol & potassium levels. **Hemogram test** can be done to check for anemia and leukemia, the **TSH** - checks the thyroid for abnormalities, and the **PSA** blood test for prostate cancer. The blood tests are done by appointment. **NOTE THE DEADLINE FOR SCHEDULING BLOOD TESTS: Contact Susie Rahn at ext. 4072 or by email before FEB. 9 if you are wanting to schedule blood tests.** There will also be screenings for bone density, cancer, allergies, blood pressure checks, body fat analysis, vision care, and much more! If you filed the paper FAFSA for 2005/2006, you will **NOT** receive a renewal application at your home address. If you filed on the web, you should receive an email notifying you to file online. The Financial Aid Office has a FAFSA ON THE WEB WORKSHEET available to assist with your online filing if you wish to pick one up. They also have the paper FAFSA forms for those who do not have online access. **YOU MUST FILE THE FAFSA TO RECEIVE ANY STATE AND/OR FEDERAL AID AND TO QUALIFY FOR A FEDERAL STAFFORD LOAN.**
