### STUDENT INSURANCE PROGRAM

An explanation of the Student Insurance Program was included with your billing statement. If you are covered under another policy, return that waiver card. If we don't receive your waiver card, you are automatically enrolled in the insurance program and will be assessed the \$520 fee. Because of billing implications, any changes need to be made by August 10<sup>th</sup>. If after this date, contact Margaret in the student development office at 260-359-4026.

### MEAL PLAN INFORMATION (for resident students)

The full meal plan is \$1750/semester. These are plans A or B. The partial plan is \$1625/semester and is plans C and D. **Special note:** residents of Meadows, Miller, Village Apartments, and student teachers have the option to purchase a 60-meal plan (E) for \$575. These meal plans are found at <http://forest.huntington.edu/> and choosing DC menu. If you run out of FLEX money (or don't have any, as in the 60-meal plan), you may purchase more - for every \$1.00 you put on your card, you get \$1.25 in FLEX money. **Because of billing implications, any meal plan changes will need to be made by Thursday, August 31<sup>st</sup> (requests after this date cannot be granted).** Check your billing statement to make sure you are on the correct plan. ### PARKING

**You will need to pick up your decal in the Student Development Office during the first two days of classes- Monday, August 28 and Tuesday, August 29 or on Sunday, August 27 from 1-5:00p. Tickets will be given starting on Wednesday, August 30. If you are on campus early, you may stop by and pick one up.**

### RESIDENCE HALLS & FORESTER VILLAGE

Your roommate and dorm room information is available on the myinfo page. You may move into the residence halls, Forester Village apartments after 12:00 p.m. (noon) on Saturday, August 26<sup>th</sup> or Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup>. Forester Village residents need to check-in with Joanna Shenk in apartment 1915 A Fruit Street x-3865 calling from off campus 260-358-3865.

### EARLY ARRIVAL

If an earlier arrival date (August 26/27) is necessary, you must contact your resident director (after August 1<sup>st</sup>) Alison Sharpe (Baker/Roush) x-3515; Laura Bruce (Hardy) x-3571; Nathan Geer (Wright/Forester Village/ Miller/Meadows) x-3647; to make the appropriate arrangements. A \$20/day fee will be assessed for early arrivals (except for athletes, RAs, CMCs or other students that are **required** to be here early). Your first meal will be supper on Sunday, August 27<sup>th</sup>.

- Because halogen lights and candles are a potential fire hazard, they will not be allowed in the residence halls.
- All incoming furniture must be approved by the RD.

### CLASS SCHEDULES

Classes begin on **Monday, August 28**. If you wish to make changes in your class schedule, you should contact the Registrar's Office as soon as possible at (260) 359-4011.

### ID CARDS

You will use your same ID card issued to you last year. Replacement cards are available for a fee of \$5.00.

## ATHLETIC UPDATE

- A young Forester baseball squad tied for sixth place in the conference standings with a record of 11-13, but missed earning a berth in the MCC Tournament by one game bringing their season to a close at 22-21. Two Foresters, junior Andy Janzen and sophomore Korey Grow, received All-Conference honors. Janzen, the top third baseman in the MCC, was among the conference leaders in several offensive categories, including batting average (.417), slugging percentage (.583), RBI (39) and hits (60). Grow, the Foresters' leftfielder, hit .340 for the season and led the team with 40 runs batted in and six triples. Coach Frame also earned the 500<sup>th</sup> win of his career early in the season and concluded the year with a career record of 521-435.
- The softball team all but doubled their win total from a year ago (7-27) with its 13-30 record under second-year head coach Doug Gower. In conference play, the women went 6-10 and finished in seventh place. Three Foresters were named to the MCC All-Conference team. Senior Kaley Fode, the Foresters' third baseman, earned All-Conference honors for the second straight year. She was the team's RBI leader, driving in a team-high 21 runs and she hit .325 on the year. Sophomore Kendra Stahl, HU's centerfielder, led the team with her .341 batting average and also drove in 18 runs and freshman Lauren Ward, the Foresters' leading pitcher, tallied 162 strikeouts on the season and posted an impressive 1.97 ERA.
- The Forester men's track team finished fifth in the conference meet and put two freshmen on the All-Conference team. Dan Lindbloom earned the honor by winning the 3000 meter steeplechase and Lucas Beach received an at-large selection based on the number of points he scored in the meet. Both sophomore Joel Sanders and Beach qualified for the NAIA Outdoor Track National Championships. Sanders competed in the 800 meter run and placed 20<sup>th</sup> in the preliminaries with a time of 1:57.47. Beach did not place after foul on all three preliminary attempts. During the indoor season, four Foresters participated in the NAIA Indoor Track National Championships. Sanders (800, 2:28.62) and Beach (shot put, 53' 2.25") both finished fifth in their respective events to earn NAIA All-America honors. Cody Hannie finished 20<sup>th</sup> in the 800 with a time of 1:58.35 and Nick Johnson was 26<sup>th</sup> in the 3000 with a time of 9:02.86.
- On the women's side, the Foresters finished sixth in the conference standings this season. Five Foresters earned All-Conference honors. Brittany Fillman repeated as the 400 meter champion, Lisa Isabelli won the hammer throw and Emily Sealscott took the 3000 meter steeplechase, while Heidi Christner and Katie Crandall were both at-large selections. Sealscott was the lone female to qualify for the NAIA Outdoor Track National Championships. She ran in the 3000 meter steeplechase and finished 15<sup>th</sup> with a time of 12:44.04. In the indoor season, freshman Jill Roughia qualified for the NAIA Indoor Track National Championships in the 1000 meter race. She finished 20<sup>th</sup> with a time of 3:11.57.
