AS you are coming to conference, please let me lay some more burden on you; There is L. M. Davis, at College. Please ascertain whether he could be used as much as two Sundays a month in some pretty easily accessible part of the north part of White River Conference district, to preach and perhaps make pastoral visits a half day each time. Please also get the best counsel as to whether Bro. Wechler would be likely to be acceptable to Hartford circuit. Also, as to whether A. A. Powell could be had for the same, only provided Wechler would not be likely to succeed. Is there any other preacher who could be used two Sundays in the month. Could not Charles Clay be had? And would he not be promising of success? I like him very much. Would Davis be likely to succeed?

White River is not named as a mission conference, but perhaps it is the most promising field in the church for missionary results, and therefore I can ask your help. Probably more can be saved in its district in one year than can be gathered in any other conference in five or even ten years. I hope you will be so kind as to bring to conference all the helpful, positive information possible as to preachers available for fields in White River.
