I notice in the recent number of the Missionary Monthly, a communication from L. E. Paul, of Kansas City. He says that with Enos Davis and a man by the name of Allen, they went into three brothels and spoke to the inmates about their souls' welfare. It reminded me of an evangelist of Illinois of national reputation, who in Mr. Moody's meeting many years ago, told of his and a brother going into a brothel, and finding the inmates very willing to listen to gospel truths. Mr. Moody was silent, but before he dismissed the assembly, twenty minutes later, he said: There were somethings said to which he wished to enter his decided ~~objection~~ ^{protest}. Referring to what this brother had said, he said that men had no proper business in brothels, but there were plenty of good women to go there. There was not a word answered to Mr. Moody's remark. Perhaps a similar reply to this brother Paul would have been better than the publication of his remarks.

I recently visited the Aunt of Constance Wilberforce, at her mother's on this city. She says they sent money for Constance to come home on but the last heard from, she had not come. It is possible that Wilberforce folks, ~~except~~ the disagreement she wrote about, are good to Constance. Of Joe's unworthiness there can be no doubt. I suppose the trouble you wrote about, that Christopher had with a girl to whom he ^{has} "married" the country fashion, was of the sexual order. If so it is sad. After all our time and expense with the Wilberforces, have we not one who is true!

I am not satisfied with our superintendent in Africa. Such a man as he ought not to be put at the head of our mission. I am informed that he belongs to a family, of which he is the flower! I do not blame Brother Linker for his unwillingness to be under such superintendence. He would do for anything but a superintendent. He may mean well enough. It gives us poor prestige, outside our mission.
