NOTES:

- Students are strongly encouraged to complete MA 151 as the core curriculum math requirement prior to taking CO 380 and 421.
- CO 481 has a prerequisite of CO 111. Students must receive consent from the instructor of CO 481 to take CO 111 concurrently.
- Six hours must be taken from: CO 322, 346, 370, 371, 381, 395 (up to 3 times), 495.
- Outside electives should be taken in complementary areas outside the department. Students will choose 6 hours of 300- or 400-level courses approved by the department.
- Students must make sure they meet the appropriate prerequisites before registering for any upper division courses outside the communication department.
- Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
- Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
