3. A grade of "C" or higher is required in each of the following courses: EN121; CO 215; CH 141/L; PY 111 and 230; SO 111; MA 151; BI 232/L, 241/L and 242/L.
4. Students must be accepted into the nursing program before being granted clinical placement.
5. Nursing majors may repeat science and math courses once and remain eligible to enter the nursing program.
