NOTES:

1. HE 111 Elementary Hebrew I (Fall Even Years) and HE 121 Elementary Hebrew II (Spring Odd Years) may be taken in place of GR 111 and GR 121.
2. Must take three hours from BT 320, 331, or 333CT.
3. Nine hours from the following Advanced Biblical Literature courses must be taken: BT 441, 442, 443, 445, 446, and 447.
4. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
5. Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
6. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
