NOTES:

- 1. Students are strongly encouraged to complete MA 151 as the core curriculum math requirement prior to taking CO 380 and 421.
- 2. Six hours must be taken from: CO 322, 346, 370, 371, 381, 395 (up to 3 times), 495.
- 3. Outside electives should be taken in complementary areas outside the department. Students will choose 6 hours of 300- or 400-level courses approved by the department.
- 4. Students must make sure they meet the appropriate prerequisites before registering for any upper division courses outside the communication department.
- 5. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
- 6. Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
- 7. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
