### NOTES:

1. A double major or an extensive minor is easily arranged in the above program.
2. Students are strongly encouraged to complete 12 hours in the same language to fulfill the language requirement.
3. PS 111 Public Policy and SO 111 Principles of Sociology are highly recommended for fulfillment of the Core Social Science requirements, PL 260 Ethics for fulfilling the Core Philosophy requirement, and MA 151 is recommended for fulfilling the Core Mathematics requirement.
4. Students pursuing pre-law may opt to substitute EN 455 for one of the 400 Level courses except for EN 431.
5. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list to enhance the English-literature major: EN 331, 362, 363, 391, 455, CO 241, 342.
6. Students who intend to take the LSAT (Law School Admission Test) as part of an application to law school should take PL 240. Also for the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351; CO 370, 381; PS 377, 428, 434, 466; SO 292, 333, and 345. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites for courses you opt to take.
7. Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law J-term courses (e.g. mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
