NOTES:

1. Either MA 161 or MA 171 will fulfill the major requirement in math. MA 171 is recommended for those anticipating graduate school.
2. Students must take three of the following OA 215 Business Software Application courses or equivalent certificate: Word Processing (by examination only), Spreadsheet, Advanced Spreadsheet, Database, and Computer Graphics.
3. Three hours from Business, Economics and Finance, or Accounting offerings may be taken in place of BA 213.
4. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate with a bachelor's degree, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
5. Students must apply for acceptance and be admitted into the MBA program.
6. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
