NOTES:

1. Students who plan to go to graduate school should take MA 151 as their core curriculum mathematics course. If a student believes that he/she will not pursue a Master's degree in Social Work (MSW), the option of another 100 level core curriculum mathematics course may be selected.
2. SW 395 Intercultural Immersion Experience may be taken in a different term besides January for 1-3 credit hours.
3. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
4. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
