### NOTES:

- SO 490 may be taken in place of SO 495. Students may take SO 490/495 for 2-4 credit hours. If students take less than 4 credit hours, additional elective hours must be taken.
- Twenty-one additional hours in sociology, which may include PY 321 and SW 236, are required.
- Sociology majors may not count SO 141 toward the core social science requirement.
- Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
- Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
- Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
