NOTES:

1. Fifteen hours must be chosen from: DM 115, 155, 231, 251, 281, 341, 395, or other approved electives in the major. DM 115 will also fulfill the core curriculum artistic appreciation requirement.
2. SM 496SMAC may be taken in 3-12 hour increments. A grade of B- or higher is required for SM 496SMAC.
3. Students are required to have 128 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses and 3 J-Terms in at least 2 departments.
4. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
