2. Fifteen hours must be chosen from: BA 311, 312, 351, 431; EB 212; EX 318; OA 371; or other approved electives in the major.
3. SM 496SMAC may be taken in 3-12 hour increments, and students may take up to 12 hours. A grade of B- or higher is required for SM 496SMAC.
4. Students are required to have 120 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses.
5. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
