NOTES:

1. Must take three hours from BT 320, 331, or 333CT.
2. Nine hours from the following Advanced Biblical Literature courses must be taken: BT 441, 442, 443, 445, 446, and 447.
3. Students are required to have 120 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses.
4. Students completing a BA degree are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or complete at least 6 hours in the same foreign language and up to 6 additional hours in either another foreign language or in designated cultural enrichment course.
5. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
