NOTES:

1. EN 121 and 151 are core curriculum requirements and are prerequisites to courses in the English department.
2. Twelve hours must be taken from EN 311, 321, 374, 375, 386, 387, 431, 452, 453, 454 or DM 330.
3. Students completing a BA degree in English are required to complete 12 hours in the same language or at least six hours in the same language coupled with six hours of cultural enrichment courses to fulfill the language requirement.
4. Students are required to have 120 hours to graduate, including a minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses.
5. Students who have taken AP exams, early-entry or dual-credit courses may be able to lighten the number of credits needed during a given semester and may even eliminate the need for summer coursework. The Registrar's Offices' evaluation of prior coursework will help students and their academic advisors plan out degree requirements.
