NOTES:

1. HS 222 Historical Method should be taken the freshman year.
2. PS 111 and EB 211 may be counted as the social science requirements in the core curriculum.
3. One course must be taken from HS 322, 411, 434, or 477.
4. One course must be taken from HS 318, 344, 361, 385, 456, or 463.
5. One course must be taken from HS 346, 373, or 376.
6. Six hours of HS electives (300 level or above) must be taken.
7. Students must complete at least 6 hours in the same language and six hours of additional language courses or cultural enrichment courses to fulfill the University’s foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible. Students are strongly encouraged to complete 12 hours of foreign language study in a modern language.
8. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
9. Students may substitute another recommended Pre-Law upper-division course for this course.
10. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351, CO 370, CO 381, PL 240, PL 260, PS 321, PS 434, PS 477, SO 292, SO 333, or SO 345. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites you opt to take.
