3. MA 151 Probability and Statistics is necessary and will fulfill the core math requirement.
4. BT 333TB Theological Bioethics is necessary and will fulfill the core non-introductory Bible requirement.
5. PL 260 Ethics may be taken in place of PL 220 Introduction to Philosophy. However, PL 220 Introduction to Philosophy is recommended since students are required to take BT 333TB Theological Bioethics for their major.
6. All “OT” courses must be taken in residence (not transferrable), and students must earn a grade of **B-** or better in all “OT” courses.
