

Summer 2023 Undergraduate Schedule of Offerings - Huntington

May Term tuition for on-campus courses is \$330 per credit hour. Summer tuition for online courses is \$424 per credit hour. Internships and practicums are charged at a special rate of \$199 per credit hour. Housing and Food for Summer Term courses is \$250 per week. Courses designated as ON are online offerings. International students are permitted to take **no more than 3 credits of online** courses per semester but SEVIS regulations do not limit online classes in summer term.

Course Descriptions for May Term Courses

AG211 Agritourism

Agritourism is considered a new industry, but is it really? This course will discuss the types of agritourism as well as the history of agritourism. Several tours of various agritourism locations will take place in the region. *May count as an elective in the agribusiness, animal science, crop science, or agricultural education majors.*

AR106 Basic Calligraphy

Decorative yet functional, calligraphy has been considered an art form for centuries. This course will introduce the basics of calligraphy writing and decoration. After learning basic strokes of three main calligraphic forms, students will make their own products using traditional pen and ink mediums. The history of calligraphy will be incorporated in the hands-on class. *May count as a creative studio arts course.*

AR150 The Art of Woodcarving

This course will begin by introducing students to the basic cuts in woodcarving, including the stop-cut, the v-cut, and the paring cut. Students will practice this by doing some basic projects such as a Moravian star. After the basic cuts are developed, the students will move on to other beginning projects such as the 5-minute owl and the 15-minute wizard (both of which take beginners much longer). Once these have been completed, students will carve a hillbilly caricature figure, followed by another figure of a similar nature, but which they can add their personal touch to. *May count as a creative studio arts course.*

CJ224 Criminal Justice in London

Behind the gorgeous facades of London's classic buildings lie the tales of criminal justice and law. Starting at the near-millennium-old Tower of London, you will track the evolution of the British legal system, exploring from inside the Royal Courts of Justice, the Inns of Court, and the Old Bailey. Students will gain understanding of how the British justice system has influenced the American criminal justice system. Trip dates: May 3-10, 2023. *May count as an elective in criminal justice or sociology majors.*

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NU211 Introduction to Medical Spanish

Students will learn common medical vocabulary and phrases in Spanish. They will practice patient-provider interactions, utilizing medical Spanish vocabulary and incorporating introductory Spanish language skills. Prior Spanish knowledge is helpful but not required.

OT141 Developmental Care in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit

Developmental care encompasses holistic and infant-driven strategies implemented in the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) setting to support long-term developmental success of preterm and medically fragile infants, and positive family outcomes. This course covers many topics in the NICU, including exploration of evidence-based developmental care strategies. Students will engage in frequent multi-sensory, hands-on learning opportunities in this course. Developmental care exploration is beneficial to any student (OTA, nursing, social work, psychology, education, etc.) interested in working with families and infants in the NICU or any post-NICU setting.

PY154 Game Design and Development

This course will focus on the game development process. Students will read essays on game mechanics effective rule writing, balancing a game, playtesting, self-publishing, game promotion, networking, and creating a Kickstarter campaign. The professor will discuss game dynamics, educational games, creating a developmentally appropriate game, and what makes games psychologically appealing. Students will create their own board game, card game, or role-playing game, playtest the game, and learn what it would take to market their idea. *May count as an elective in the psychology major.*

SS134 Entering Adulthood

Adulthood...how do I even do that? Entering Adulthood will involve exploring and developing a successful roadmap for becoming an adult. In this course, students will look at important issues and responsibilities such as personal finance, insurance, faith in adulthood, decision-making, career issues, finding a home, dealing with transition, navigating interpersonal relationships, healthful living, and priorities. Students will be able to actively practice many of these skills, discuss with peers, hear from people who are living it, and start to develop some good habits as an adult.

TH106 Acting for Non-Majors

Students will learn basic principles and theories of acting through monologue and scene work. *May count as a creative studio arts course.*
