Flo, thanks again for the good information on low enrollment programs, which would include all our Middle Grades Programs except Math, which has had exactly 5 graduates in the past 3 years (3 in 09-1-, 1 in 10-11, and 1 in 11-12). As I looked at the Protocol document for program review again, that raised another question.

Since 2000, our Middle Grades program was based on the Elementary Primary and Intermediate split, so we recommended our completers for the Elementary Intermediate and the appropriate MS license. With the advent of REPA and the return to a single elementary license, we changed our program (as well as our catalog and program guides) to a dual licensure for K-6 Elementary Generalist and Middle School Math (LA, SS, SC) license. This means that the Middle Grades program which the state would be evaluating in September will actually cease to exist after August of next year, putting it in the category of programs that will be closed within one year of the program review. We even had those who were sophomores in Fall of 2010 signed a statement acknowledging that if they delayed graduation and failed to graduate before August 2013, they would have to meet the requirements of the new programs and the new testing. So, if my interpretation is correct, we would not submit the Middle Grades Math for review either. Is that your interpretation as well?

Either way, I will be submitting our Art Education program for review. We have had 8 graduates in the past 3 years in that program.
