NOTES:

1. Please make certain “what kind of undecided” the student is—really undecided or just undecided between two or three possible choices.
2. If the student is truly undecided, then follow the above course scheme.
3. Emphasize that the student should make an appointment sometime during the semester with Martha Smith to talk about career options, testing, etc.
4. If the student has some ideas about possible interests, suggest taking a course in that area to explore things a bit. This course probably should be substituted for PY 111 in the first semester or for the laboratory science in the second semester. If the exploration course does not count as Core Curriculum, be sure to point that out. Students who are considering a major in teacher education must complete PY 111 during the freshman year.
5. Students considering a major in Bible and religion should NOT take BR 111. Students considering math programs do not take MA 151 or MA 115. Students considering science programs normally do not take CH 111, PH 111 or BI 111. Please consult the registrar or the department advisor for students considering these programs.
