NOTES:

- Four semesters of Greek recommended, but only GR 111 is required. Students may substitute 6 hours of another language and a cultural enrichment course for GR 121 and GR 211.
- Nine hours from the following Advanced Biblical Literature courses must be taken: BR 441, 442, 443, 444, 445, 446, 447, and GR 421.
- Six hours from 300 or 400 level complementary courses outside the Bible and Religion department or additional courses within the department (additional courses could include BR 331, 333, 421, 440, and 460).
- BR 311 does not count toward major requirements.
- Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
