

## Huntington University | Students in Huntington, Indiana

**As previously announced, beginning March 25, 2020, all academic coursework will move to a virtual and online format.** Additional academic support information will continue to be provided to students through Moodle course websites, Coffey Break, Forester Feed, and other HU email announcements.

Beginning March 19, 2020, and continuing until further notice, the following facilities will be closed except for essential personnel\* and off limits for use by visitors, non-HU residents, or general students, faculty, and staff:

- The PLEX (Merillat Complex & Fieldhouse)
- RichLyn Library

Although the Follett Bookstore will be closed at its on-campus location within RichLyn Library, the [online bookstore](#) will remain open.

Academic support services in the [Academic Center for Excellence \(ACE\)](#) will continue but will be delivered virtually. ACE will provide support for students using Zoom technology. It is HU's intention to offer tutoring options using Zoom or similar technology. Testing services will be suspended until further notice.

Beginning March 25, 2020, **students who do not need to utilize campus housing or dining services are encouraged to stay at home or where most comfortable to continue their studies online. Please continue this course of action until further notice.** The University will revisit this notice on or before April 10.

Students will have limited general access to a computer lab (Dowden Science Hall 175/177 from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.). Additional lab areas may have limited access to students enrolled in certain programs. Students will need to check with their course instructors to determine access schedules and limitations.

Students enrolled in applied experiential learning (ex. clinicals, internships, practica, fieldwork, and student teaching) should communicate directly with their department director or fieldwork coordinator to determine a completion plan for these experiences.

The revised dining schedule is as follows:

Breakfast: 7:00 a.m. – 9:00 a.m.

Lunch: 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.

Dinner: 5:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m.

All food stations will be manned by and all food will be served by Chartwells staff. All meals will be portable. Students will receive two clamshells and a to-go drink cup.

We are continuing to ask students to be sure to check in with Dean of Students, Brian Jaworski, to confirm their return.

For the spring 2020 semester, we are suspending the requirement for earned chapel credit. While we move forward as a virtual community, we'll continue to provide you with weekly spiritual programs and services through our online outlets. Please continue to check your HU email, the Coffey Break, and social media to learn more about the opportunities that will be available.

Faculty will be available to students through electronic communication (email) and may set up virtual office hours, as well. Please contact your course instructor for specific details.

Library personnel will be available through electronic communication (email), web access, and phone to ensure student success.

**Campus offices will have very limited staffing through March 27.** We encourage employees who can to work from home during this period. **However, all campus offices will be staffed at some minimum level and open via telephone or email to respond to your needs.**
