

COVID-19 (Coronavirus) Update: March 6, 2020

There are currently no reported incidents of COVID-19 at Huntington University or in the state of Indiana.

Huntington University, like all universities, is a residential campus community and therefore must be vigilant. With many common touch points (computer labs, doorknobs, chairs, bathrooms, bleachers, etc.) we already have a high custodial standard, but as we watch COVID-19 spread from the coasts toward the middle of the country, we have increased our standards. We are increasing our cleaning schedule and sanitation protocols and have increased the number of sanitation stations around the campus community.

As spring break approaches (March 15-21), Dr. Ron Coffey is monitoring all officially planned University travel. At this time, no trips have been cancelled, rescheduled, or redirected.

Huntington University leadership is collaborating efforts to plan for e-learning opportunities and special accommodations for events, ceremonies, and gatherings should the need arise.

We are reviewing summer and fall international trips and monitoring the countries of interest closely. We have suspended our usual trips to China for the summer of 2020.
