**NOTES:**

- Twelve hours must be taken from EN 331, 337, 344, 362, 363, 391, 455, 475; CO241, 342, or 395.
- A double major or an extensive minor is easily arranged in the above program.
- Students majoring in English in the BA degree must complete 12 hours in the same language to fulfill the language requirement.
- Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken.  
A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
- PS111 Public Policy and SO111 Principles of Sociology are highly recommended for fulfillment of the Core Social Science requirements, PL260 Ethics for fulfilling the Core Philosophy requirement, and MA151 is recommended for fulfilling the Core Mathematics requirement.
- EN455 is highly recommended as one of the English Electives as it will improve students’ understanding of grammar and language use.
- For the General Electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA351, CO381, CO370, HS466, HS368, HS377, PL240, PL260, SO223, SO292, SO333, or SO444. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites for courses you opt to take.
- Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law J-term courses (e.g. mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
