2. Students majoring in English in the BA degree must complete 12 hours in the same language to fulfill the language requirement.
3. PS 111 Public Policy and SO 111 Principles of Sociology are highly recommended for fulfillment of the Core Social Science requirements, PL 260 Ethics for fulfilling the Core Philosophy requirement, and MA 151 is recommended for fulfilling the Core Mathematics requirement.
4. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list to enhance the English-literature major: EN 331, 362, 363, 391, 455, CO 241, 342.
5. Also for the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351, CO 370, CO 381, HS 466, HS 368, HS 377, PL 240, PL 260, SO 223, SO 292, SO 333, or SO 345. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites for courses you opt to take.
6. Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law J-term courses (e.g. mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
