NOTES:

1. Either MA 161 or MA 171 will fulfill the major requirement in math. MA 171 is recommended for those anticipating graduate school.
2. Students must take three of the following OA215 Business Software Application courses or an equivalent certificate: Word Processing, Spreadsheet, Database, and Computer Graphics.
3. PY 111 is recommended for those who anticipate having a minor in marketing or entrepreneurial small business.
4. Many states, including Indiana, require candidates for the CPA examination to have earned 150 semester hours of college level credit and earn a bachelor's degree prior to sitting for the exam. Students may meet the Indiana requirements at HU in a number of ways. Expanding the above accounting major to include ten additional upper level hours in business, along with a minor, such as marketing, economics or computer science, will fulfill the requirements. Students should meet with their academic advisor to discuss other acceptable courses of study or to review requirements of other states.
