- 1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
- 2. PL 260 may be counted as the philosophy requirement in the core curriculum. PS 111 and EB 211 may be counted as the social science requirements in the core curriculum.
- 3. Students considering graduate study in political science should take MA 151 as their core curriculum mathematics requirement.
- 4. One course from the major must be chosen from the following courses: PS 346, 364, 385, 456, 495.
- 5. Students may take PS 466 American Constitutional History (Fall Odd Years) in place of PS 377.
- 6. Students must complete 6 hours in the same language to fulfill the University's foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible.
- 7. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation.
- 8. Students are encouraged to take appropriate Pre-Law related J-term courses (e.g., mock trial, internship in criminal justice system or law firm).
- 9. Students may substitute another recommended Pre-Law upper-division course for this course.
- 10. For the general electives, it is recommended that students consider taking courses from the following list: BA 351, CO 370, CO 381, HS 377, HS 466, PL 240, PL 260, SO 223, SO 292, SO 333, or SO 345. Be sure to check that you have any necessary prerequisites you opt to take.
