NOTES:

1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
2. Six hours must be taken from HS 322 (*Spring Even*), 337 (*Spring Odd*), 477 (*Fall Odd*) and 487 (*Fall Even*). The remaining two seminar courses are recommended as electives.
3. Twelve hours of HS electives must be taken, eight of which must be in 300+ level courses.
4. Students must complete 6 hours in the same language to fulfill the University’s foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible.
5. Students are urged to choose appropriate electives to complete a second major.
6. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation
7. PS 111 may be counted as one of the social science requirements in the core curriculum.
