**NOTES:**

1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
2. Six hours must be taken from HS 322 (*Spring Even*), 337 (*Spring Odd*), 477 (*Fall Odd*) and 487 (*Fall Even*). The remaining two seminar courses are recommended as electives.
3. PS 111 may be counted as one of the social science requirements in the core curriculum.
4. Twelve hours of HS electives must be taken, eight of which must be in 300+ level courses.
5. Students must complete 6 hours in the same language to fulfill the University’s foreign language requirement. Students who have studied a language in high school and wish to continue this language are encouraged to do so their freshman year if possible. Students considering graduate study in history are strongly encouraged to complete 12 hours of foreign language study in a modern language.
6. Up to six hours of approved substitutes may be included in the major.
7. Students are urged to choose appropriate electives to complete a second major. Majors must be careful in selection of electives so that a sufficient number of upper division courses are taken. A minimum of 36 hours of 300+ courses is required for graduation
