**NOTES:**

1. HS 222 should be taken the freshman year.
2. Six hours must be taken from HS 322 (*Spring Even*), 337 (*Spring Odd*), 477 (*Fall Odd*) and 487 (*Fall Even*). The remaining two seminar courses are recommended as electives.
3. Nine hours must be taken from the following Political Science courses: PS 346, 358, 377, 446, 455, 456, 466 or an approved J-Term Political Science course. The nine hours must include PS 377 or 466 (the remaining course is recommended as an elective if not taken as one of the nine hours of Political Science courses).
4. ED 395 Multicultural Practicum in Teaching should be scheduled during January Term of the junior year.
5. Students may add a content concentration in economics by completing EB 212 and one additional 300 or 400-level EB course, a content concentration in psychology by completing PY 211 and six additional hours in psychology, or a content concentration in sociology by completing SO 292, 321 and three additional hours in sociology.
